## Fours - 2008/2009

- Daily Schedule:
- Arrival is at 8:30am and dismissal is at 2:45pm (from the room).

Please be punctual!! We have morning meeting at $8: 45 \mathrm{am}$ with the children, and they need time to settle into the classroom and say
goodbye to adults. The music is your cue to say goodbye to your child and direct them to the rug. It is not unusual to see some regression in the first several weeks.

Please be prompt when picking up your child. We release children only to parents and designated caregivers. If someone else will be picking up your child, you must leave us a note on the bulletin board by the classroom door. It is very important for us to see your child and grown-up leaving together, so please be sure to say good-bye to us! Also, for playdates, both sets of parents must leave a note explaining who will pick up the children. Please let caregivers and other adults know this routine!

The daily schedule is posted in the rug area. It uses both words and pictures.

- Meeting - A time to gather as a group, discuss the schedule for the day, talk about group issues that come up, and important news from children. Meetings also help children to practice patience, turn taking, listening, responding, and focusing on the topic. Generally, we don't do show\&tell, unless it is a rare and special item (something from nature found on a trip).
- Work - Children select an activity (blocks, paperwork, painting, etc). The goal is for the Fours to work with commitment and make social connections to their peers. Please dress children comfortably, and in clothes suitable to get dirty. At the end of worktime, the children pick-up all of the materials.
- Snack - This consists of crackers, fresh fruit, juice, and cheese. Snack is an important time to socialize with peers and learn passing, turn-taking, and conversation skills.
- Roof - We go up to the roof in all kinds of weather, so please dress your child accordingly. We also ask that you please send your child with sturdy shoes that are comfortable (no flip-flops). Activities on the roof are geared towards cooperative play, as well as gross motor skill development. There are climbers, a sandbox, and large hollow blocks for the children to create their own play spaces.
- Story - After roof, we come downstairs and meet on the carpet for a story. We then transition to lunch and rest.
- Lunch - A hot lunch (meat and vegetables) and sandwiches are served every day. It is not unusual for the children to eat only a little bit during the first weeks of school. We will let you know if there are any issues with eating habits.
- Rest - This is a quiet and peaceful time when children can look at books, draw (journals and crayons will be introduced in the coming weeks), and listen to music. Each child may bring a small stuffed animal \& blanket. Please leave action figures and Barbies at home (as these can be distracting to others!)
- Afternoon work time - This is a time when the group is sometimes in half groups (during specials classes), and we work on more focused projects such as cooking, writing \& dictation, and science and math activities.
- Closing meeting - This is a time for the Fours to wrap-up the day and come together as a group. We often share what happened during the day and discuss social issues that came up. We also look ahead to tomorrow's schedule. The final part of closing meeting is doing the Paper Chain, where we count how many days we've been at school.
- Common language we use with the children ("isms"):
- "Steady" - This word is used to describe the children's body position and behavior. When your body is calm \& under control, you are steady.
- "Work" - We use this word to refer to the children's explorations with the materials. Play is the work of young children.
- "Pick-up" - This is used as opposed to 'clean-up,' which implies dirty or messy.
- Parent/Teacher communication
- Phone calls - We are available in the classroom between 8-8:30am and 3-3:30pm. For important changes to pick-up arrangements, please leave message at the front desk and ask that it be hand delivered to the room.
- Please keep us posted on parent travel, medications, nightmares, or any changes to routines.
- Emails - We regularly send reminders or logistical information by email. If you would like to discuss anything about your child, you may email convenient times to reach you, and we will be happy to call you or speak in person.
- Monthly letters - These are posted on the LREI blog, which is sent out on Thursday afternoon. Please check the blog for updates about happenings in the classroom.
- Parent / Teacher conferences - This is an important time to talk about your child's progress and experiences in school. Conferences are scheduled in November and April. Parents are encouraged to schedule additional meetings any time there are concerns or information to be shared.
- Assemblies - Parent assemblies are scheduled throughout the year, and we will keep you posted on the dates.
- Illnesses
- Please keep your child home if he/she is not feeling well enough to participate fully in the day, or if he/she is contagious or feverish. The child must be fever-free for a 24 hour period before returning to school.
Please call or email if your child will be out. Kitty our nurse is responsible for dispensing all medications, which should be given to her directly with instructions.
- Birthdays
- Birthdays are celebrated at the end of the school day (at about 2:30pm). Parents are invited to come. We ask that any special treats (cupcakes, etc.) be identical, including frosting/sprinkles colors, since differences can cause upsets and hurt feelings! Please remember NO NUTS OR SEEDS OR OAT PRODUCTS OR CHOCOLATE! For birthdays that fall during the summer, we will have a collective summer birthday party in June. For home birthday parties or parties happening outside of school, invitations must be sent through the mail. Such parties are best held on the weekends, as the anticipation often affects classroom activities and behaviors.
- Cubbies - please clean out cubbies and paper cubbies every Friday, and replenish clothing as needed (changes in size and season).

Thank you so much for all of your support in these first few weeks of school. We're looking forward to a terrific year in the Fours!
