"I felt like my classroom was transformed. I expected a school day from 1911 and that's what I got."
"It was challenging to hear the stereotypes that boys are smarter and stronger than girls. It made me mad."
"The teachers were really strict. I could barely tell it was them!"
"I learned that I love stickball and kick the can!"
We hope you will have a chance to view the wonderful Art show. Many of our fourth graders enjoyed being the docents for the show and did a wonderful job in explaining their creative wonders to the many visitors.

We are so sorry we had to cancel our field trip today but will reschedule for very soon. The children are now studying the history of The Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire and labor laws. There will be a PBS special airing this coming Monday evening marking the $100^{\text {th }}$ anniversary of the events of March 25, 1911.
